It's so wonderful to see the results from creative students when given an open task. The students had 2 constraints.
Create a clay piece that can:

- 1. Hold three pens/pencils,
- 2. Demonstrate attaching a part using the score and slip method. Here are their widely different and personal ideas in progress. This is the greenware stage.

The clay is drying for two weeks before being ready to go into the kiln where it will be bisque fired. Then the students will use underglaze to bring their creations into full colour with a clear glaze applied to finish them off. I'm so proud of their efforts so far and cannot wait to see the final results. Watch this space!
