IMSS NEWS (Instrumental Music School Services)

One of the unique and highly regarded programs for students in public schools is the instrumental music program run in schools through Instrumental Music School Services. Selection into this program is based on musical aptitude testing and other cri-

teria. If your child is selected, this outstanding program will take your child's love of music to the next level. They will receive free instrumental tuition and the opportunity to participate in a range of music enrichment activities.

The teaching standard is extremely high. As well as having a passion for music, instrumental teachers are qualified musicians and registered teachers.

To participate in the program students must have:

- a high level of aptitude
- a willingness to participate in the instrumental music program
- parent support
- availability to attend all instrumental lessons (during school hours)

Students who have been nominated will be assessed for suitability during normal school hours.

This term all Year 4 students were given the Aptitude Test to gain entry into the IMSS program in 2023. (Any absentees will be followed up in Term 4).

The next step will be to address the other criteria, which includes their attitude, commitment and behaviour in the classroom assessed by their classroom and Music teacher, potential ability and capability by the Instrumental Teacher and commitment to follow through with parent support.

There are limited spaces are available in the program. The instruments offered at Margaret River PS are Trumpet and Trombone (brass), Flute and Clarinet (Woodwind), Guitar and Concert Xylophone/Drum kit (Percussion). In Term 4 after the assessments have been undertaken, successful applicants will receive an Expression of Interest Letter (this does not guarantee and place in the program), following this a formal Offer will be sent to successful applicants. A meeting will be held at MRPS in the Music room for those parents of successful applicants on **Monday 14/11/22 in Week 6 from 4 – 5 pm.**

Parents of successful applicants are highly encouraged to attend.

Australian Chamber Orchestra








Book Week 2022

Student Health and Wellbeing

MRPS Code of Conduct incorporates six core values:

Cooperation, Empathy, Enthusiasm, Flexibility, Honesty and Respect





Honesty is being fair, just and truthful; not cheating or stealing.

Honesty means you don't say things about people that aren't true. You are not being honest if you make up rumours about someone. An example of not being honest is when people spread rumours about others at school or on social media.

Honesty includes not hiding the truth because that is deceiving, not breaking rules to gain an advantage because that is cheating, and not taking something that isn't yours because that is stealing.

Remember that, "Honesty is the Best Policy."

For our last article for term three we are talking about setting GOALS.

It is useful to have a goal to help us achieve what we want, to feel successful and to be confident. Like all of the tools of resilience, goal setting is a skill that needs to be practised. It can also raise your self-confidence when you have achieve your goal. Lets' set a short term goal (Maybe for the school holidays or for 4th term?) let's see who can achieve their goal! Here are some examples:

Independence goal: practise your times tables, have a clean bedroom

Health goal: eat more fruit and vegetables

Self-discipline goal: do your homework without being asked

Social goal: go watch a friend play sport

Relationship goal: listen to your parents without talking back

Financial goal: help with jobs around the house (maybe earn some pocket money!)

Maybe a goal is to start walking to school more often, we are slowly seeing some more sunshine. Setting goals gives you long-term vision and short-term motivation. It focuses your acquisition of knowledge, and helps you to organize your time and your resources so that you can make the very most of your life. You need to be persistent and patient. Break goals down into small chunks and focus on your strengths.
