








Yesterday students from Rooms 10 and 11 celebrated the completion of their Muliticultural Australia Projects, presenting their group projects to their peers.

IMSS NEWS (Instrumental Music School Services)

One of the unique and highly regarded programs for students in public schools is the instrumental music program run in schools through Instrumental Music School Services.

Selection into this program is based on musical aptitude

testing and other criteria. If your child is selected, this outstanding program will take your child's love of music to the next level. They will receive free instrumental tuition and the opportunity to participate in a range of music enrichment activities.

The teaching standard is extremely high. As well as having a passion for music, instrumental teachers are qualified musicians and registered teachers.

To participate in the program students must have:

- a high level of aptitude
- a willingness to participate in the instrumental music program
- parent support
- availability to attend all instrumental lessons (during school hours)
- time to practice daily.

Students who have been nominated will be assessed for suitability during normal school hours.

Student selection and commitment - Department of Education

This term all Year 4 students were given the Aptitude Test to enter the IMSS program in 2023. (Any absentees will be assessed on Wednesday 19/11/2022 @9.00 am). The next step will be to address the other criteria, which includes their attitude, commitment and behaviour in the classroom assessed by their Classroom and Music teacher, potential ability and capability by the Instrumental Teacher and commitment to follow through with parent support.

As you can well imagine limited spaces are available in the program. We have a designated allocation. The instruments offered at Margaret River PS are Trumpet and Trombone (brass), Flute and Clarinet (Woodwind), Guitar and Concert Xylophone/Drum kit (Percussion).

In Term 4 after the assessments have been undertaken, successful applicants will receive an Expression of Interest Letter (this does not guarantee and place in the program), following this a formal Offer will be sent to successful applicants.

A meeting will be held at MRPS in the Music room for those parents of successful applicants on Monday 14/11/22 in Week 6 from 4-5 pm.

Parents of successful applicants will be notified as soon as all results are collated and are highly encouraged to attend Any questions you may have can be put to the Instrumental Teachers at the presentation meeting or please feel free to contact me.

Student Health and Wellbeing

MRPS Code of Conduct incorporates six core values:

VALUE

Flexibility - Easy to change or adapt.

At Margaret River Primary School, one of our core values is flexibility—the ability to adapt, change, and rise to new challenges set forth by learning experiences. At this school we help students to become flexible thinkers who are able to question existing thinking, adapt and creatively meet the demands of the future. Flexibility means being able to make changes like meeting new friends, not getting upset if there are changes or things don't go our way. Remember that a tree that isn't flexible or won't bend is easily broken.

SDERA

This term there will be inspiring and interesting information and facts to promote you and your family's health and wellbeing. Research indicates that eating well and being active are critical to your health and wellbeing in both short and long term. It also has a significant impact on children's performance at school and mindset maturing. There also will be some tips and ideas to practise mindfulness in your lives.

School Drug Education and Road Aware (SDERA) is a combined venture with the shared vision of providing "A safer and healthy population of young people". By fostering resilience, developing social skills, and providing appropriate channels for support should drug use issues exist, talking about drugs through school drug education can work to reduce potential and existing harms of drug use.

The school day is busy filled with learning new concepts and material with lots of physical activity. Food is fuel for your children's bodies, so they can concentrate and absorb all information and instructions throughout the day. Healthy food provides your child with energy and nutrients to get them through the day. Healthy eating habits begin at home, play a role in supporting and ensuring your children the importance of making healthy food choices. Children should eat a wide range of foods so that they have the energy for learning and growing. An astounding low number of Australian children – only 1in 16 – meet the recommendations for vegetable intake.

Nutrition and physical activity messages are being taught in our classrooms to promote healthy lifestyles, you can help us by putting healthy foods in their lunch boxes. Some tips are to grate some vegetables like carrot, zucchini etc. into snacks and dinners. If stuck for ideas, you can visit our MRPS Kitchen Garden Facebook page, Terri and Jodi share pictures and information about what is happening in our garden and kitchen and healthy eating ideas. Terri is also putting an article in the Mail newspaper to guide and help you on what to plant and how to look after your



garden. You can even google healthy lunch box ideas. Encourage your children to help in the garden and kitchen at home. Inspire each other looking through healthy recipes for their lunch boxes or afternoon snacks together, special bonding time.

The best way to try and avoid ill health physically and mentally is to eat a balanced diet, get plenty of sleep, stay fit and healthy and exercise regularly. Here's to eating 5 vegies and 2 fruit daily!
