







SILVERBEET, POTATO & CORN QUESADILLA

CHOPPER—BRING TWO SMALL STEEL BOWLS

2 x potatoes (diced into 1cm cubes)

2 x stems silverbeet (Stem removed and rolled and sliced thinly)

1 x corn cob (shaved off the cob)

1 x spring onion (sliced thinly)

ADD TO YOUR COLLECTORS LARGE BOWL

COLLECTORS—PUT INTO A LARGE STEEL BOWL

8 x Basil Leaves

1 x teaspoon of Garlic Powder

1 x teaspoon of Cumin

2 x tablespoons of Tomato Passata

150 grams Cheese (grated)

SEPERATELY COLLECT

3 x Tortillas

COOK—POTATOES

Put diced potatoes into a small saucepan and cover with water (1cm above the potatoes).

Boil on HIGH HEAT for 8 minutes or until soft when cut with a butter knife.

Drain the potatoes over the sink in a colander.

Add too the large bowl of collectors ingredients.

Mix all ingredients gently but combine well

TO PREPARE

Place a tortilla on the base and add half of the mix, put another tortilla on top and add the remaining mix. Place the last tortilla on the top.

Cook in the oven on 180 degrees Celsius for 10 minutes.

Value—Enthusiasm

One of Margaret River Primary School Virtues is Enthusiasm. Enthusiasm is when we have a strong liking for or interest something. We can display enthusiasm in our schoolwork by trying extra hard and listening carefully to instructions when the teacher is talking to the class. Enthusiasm includes putting your whole heart into what you do. Treating every job as important. Having a can-do attitude. Having fun and being enthusiastic. Remember nothing great was ever achieved without enthusiasm.

SDFRA

Every day we have numerous children using wheeled devices to get to school. Cycling, riding and other wheeled devices which are healthy and environmentally friendly ways to get to school. The National Ride to School Day is Friday the 24th of March. So, let's go through this list to make sure everyone's wheeled devices are safe to ride to school.

- Check that your child has a fitted helmet and protective gear
- Make sure wheels spin freely
- Check tyres (worn or flat)
- Fix any lose wheel nuts or broken spikes
- Are the brakes working?
- Make sure chain is clean and can move freely, it should be kept lightly oiled.
- Has your bike got reflectors? They should be at the front and back of the bike.
- Does your bell still work?
- Check there are no sharp edges

That's it – you're done. Did your child's bike or wheeled devise pass the safety check? If not, get it repaired straight away. Don't risk their safety.

MRPS SCHOOL PHOTO DAY IS COMING!

4th, 5th and 6th April

Dear Parents,

Your school photo day is coming! <u>Approximately two weeks prior to the photo day</u> every student will receive a personalised flyer to bring home from Kapture Photography containing your child's unique codes for ordering school photos online.



KEEP YOUR FLYER SECURE!

The unique codes contained on the flyer will be issued only once.

Order **EARLY** for sibling photography

Sibling photos can ONLY be ordered online. Once you receive the personalised flyers for your children, it is imperative that you order your sibling photo early to avoid missing out! There is a physical limit in the school schedule to how many sibling photos can be taken. Once the maximum capacity of sibling orders has been reached, no more sibling orders can be placed.

If maximum capacity is not reached, sibling orders **close 12pm midday sharp**, **one business day prior** to the first photo day.

The school or the photographers <u>cannot</u> accept late orders for sibling photography. Please do not ask as your request simply cannot be accommodated.

Order **EARLY** for discount photo day prices

Order your photos within 10 calendar days of photo day to receive discount photo day prices. Late orders are handled separately to the school delivery and incur a \$30 custom service charge.

Other information

Your school will notify you in a few weeks when **team and special group photos** are available to view and purchase on the Kapture website. Please note; class, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online prior to purchase.

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please check the FAQ's on the Kapture website.

All students will be photographed individually on photo day for school administration records AS WELL as included in their class group presentation available for purchase to all families. Should there be any reason why your child should **NOT** be included in the photo shoot –please contact the school office.
