

My background is in Behavioural Science and Counselling, and I am really passionate about supporting the wellbeing of children in our school and community.

As a school, we value supporting your child's *mental, emotional and social wellbeing* in very real and tangible ways.

Over the year the I will be encouraging a <u>whole school focus</u> on various important mental and emotional health topics such as fostering belonging and connection, emotional regulation, social and relationship skills, developing resilience and perseverance beyond the fear of failure and how to think in healthy ways about the "big" emotions including anxiety, anger and insecurity.

My role includes doing short class visits teaching/reinforcing important mental and emotional health topics, and the opportunity for students to be involved in weekly 30 minute Focus Small Groups on topics like emotional regulation, healthy relationships and mindsets that encourage resilience and growth.

I very much look forward to working with the school and consider it a privilege getting to know the students at MRPS this year.

On Thursday 7th March our new AIEO, Jansie, held a Traditional inspired leadership celebration in honour of our new Student Councillors, Faction Captains and Cultural Connections Committee Leaders.

Our new Cultural Connection Committee Leaders, First Nation students, Abbey Jack, Janice Punch, Zarah Cluss-Willamson and Lacey Bruce assisted Jansie in the design and preparation of the land art out at our school Gathering Place. They also had a voice in how the following celebration was to be performed before being joined by their fellow leaders.

The school leaders gathered around the Wongi (Yarning Circle) and mandala land art where they were invited to connect with country and contribute to the land art by having their handprint dusted on with sand by their peers. Abbey Jack proudly delivered a meaningful Acknowledgement of Country in local Wadandi language before all of the leaders had an opportunity to share their hopes and intentions for the year ahead in their new leadership roles.

With gentle feet on boodja, the students were lead in a traditional inspired movement around the Wongi before using peppermint branches to dust away the land art, the intentions to be swept away in the wind, calling on the ancestors and boodja to guide and protect these leaders in the journey within their new roles.

Did you know invertebrates make up 95% of all animal species? Join the Nearer to Nature SW team as we take a closer look at the diversity of creepy crawlies that call the forest their home. We will delve into the world of the arthropods and discover how to identify different insects and arachnids. Discover why these animals are so important to the environment as we examine their features through magnifiers.

School holidays at the farm! Facilitated sessions for kids aged between 6 and 14 years old on Tuesdays and Thursdays through the school holidays.

We set up a range of self-guided stations around the room including water colour and acrylic painting, beading and jewelry, upcycled creations, air dry clay, origami, wool weaving, hand sewing and more. The stations include age appropriate examples and written explanations to suit all ages and abilities, with two staff on hand to help out and supervise. The examples and materials change slightly each week to offer different ideas to keep kids interested and engaged.

The sessions also include a walk around the farm to visit and feed the goats, have a look in the market garden to see what's growing and kids can plant their own seeds to take home.

The farm shop and cafe will be open and you can order morning tea or lunch for the kids, or a coffee and cake for yourself to enjoy on the verandah. Food sensitivities are catered for, with vegan, nut free and gluten free options available.

The classes are drop and leave, and limited to 15 children per session. Bookings are required to secure a spot. The cost is \$21 for two hours from 10am to 12pm.
